

THE FIRST LESSON Psalm 147:1-12

¹ Hallelujah!

How good it is to sing praises to our God, who is gracious; and a song of praise is fitting.

- ² God builds up Jerusalem and gathers the outcasts of Israel.
- ³ God heals the brokenhearted, and binds up their wounds.
- ⁴ God determines the number of the stars, and gives to all of them their names.

- ⁶ God lifts up the downtrodden, and casts the wicked to the ground.

Opus Posthumous No. 10

THE SECOND LESSON John 4:1-14

Now when Jesus learned that the Pharisees had heard, "Jesus is making and baptizing more disciples than John" ²—although it was not Jesus but the disciples who baptized— ³ he left Judea and started back to Galilee. ⁴ But he had to go through Samaria. ⁵ So he came to a Samaritan city called Sychar, near the plot of ground that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. ⁶ Jacob's well was there, and Jesus, tired out by his journey, was sitting by the well. It was about noon.

⁷ A Samaritan woman came to draw water, and Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink." ⁸ (The disciples had gone to the city to buy food.) ⁹ The Samaritan woman said to Jesus, "How is it that you, a Jew, ask a drink of me, a woman of Samaria?" (Jews do not share things in common with Samaritans.) ¹⁰ Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God, and who it is that is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water." ¹¹ The woman said, "Sir, you have no bucket, and the well is deep. Where do you get that living water? ¹² Are you greater than our ancestor Jacob, who gave us the well, and with his children and his flocks drank from it?" ¹³ Jesus said to her, "Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, ¹⁴ but those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty. The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life." ¹⁵ The woman said to Jesus, "Sir, give me this water, so that I may never be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water."
